Lidia Villalobos began studying ikebana during her nine- year stay in Tokyo, Japan. She is currently a Nikyu-Iemoto-Waki Kyoju (Associate Second Term Master) in the Ohara School of Ikebana. Lidia has also studied Ikenobo, Sangetsu (in Mexico), the art of Bonsai, and Japanese gardening.

Lidia has participated in demonstrations and exhibitions at Ohara Kaikan in Tokyo, Chicago Botanical Garden, Mexico Japan Association, The Cultural Center of the Japanese Embassy in Mexico, and World Trade Center of Mexico. She has been invited to participate on numerous programs and interviewed for the newspaper Reforma and the Adam Ramones Show.

Lidia is past-president Ikebana International Mexico City #228 (2019 – 2021) and Board Member, Ikebana Iwaya Fund.
